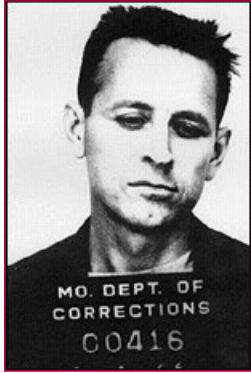

Police sources say that the FBI is withholding nationwide distribution of a composite drawing of Dr. Martin Luther King's suspected assassin. One police official says "They aren't handing out pictures of the man. They either don't have a good one or they're going it alone."

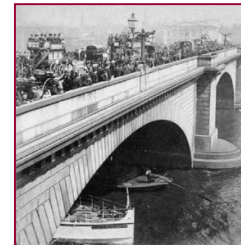


Later - The FBI charges Eric Starvo Galt with conspiracy in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King and appeals to the public for help in apprehending him.

Eric Starvo Galt, is identified by the FBI as an escaped armed robber and car thief whose real name is James Earl Ray. The FBI says it discovered the identity of Ray (40) by tediously matching faint fingerprints found during the two-week-old investigation against those of more than 53,000 fugitives described in the bureau's files.

Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy fires her 24-year-old cook after learning she planned to publish a cookbook and appear on a television series billed as "Jackie Kennedy's Gourmet Chef."

Reporters say the Credibility Gap is growing with reporters finding it tougher to cope with news manipulation by the Johnson Administration than with others before it. The annual report by the American Society of Newspaper Editors says - "The credibility gap yawns wider in the Johnson Administration than it did in preceding regimes largely because this Administration follows a policy of obscurantism for its own sake."



The London Bridge is purchased by the McCulloch Corp. of Phoenix, developers of Lake Havasu, City in Arizona - and will be reassembled there for all to see. The sale price was estimated unofficially at \$2.4 million. It will cost about \$240,000 more to ship the disassembled stones from the Thames to Arizona.

"The Nick Clooney Show" - an hour color daily audience participation and variety show will premiere May 8 over WLWC-TV in Columbus, Ohio. This week on NET (National Educational Television) - Julia Child takes you to Dinner at the White House. "For the first time, an official White House dinner is filmed for TV. Julia Child, television's famous 'French Chef' shows you what cooks when the President entertains the head of a foreign government - and 190 distinguished guests. A production of WGBH-TV, made possible by a grant from Hills Bros. Coffee."

This Saturday - it's the first showing of "The Wizard Of Oz" on NBC-TV.

WPIX-TV in New York has been reporting that Senator Robert F. Kennedy has been trimming his hair - shorter and shorter, but very slowly - gradually shortening his locks. Kennedy finally admitted it at a speech in Indiana.

Music news - The success of the soundtrack album of "The Graduate" on Columbia Records sparks the label to release "Mrs. Robinson" as a single. The arrangement of "Mrs. Robinson" on the single is entirely different from the one on the soundtrack album and is included in Simon & Garfunkel's latest album "Book Ends."

Neil Diamond signs with Uni Records - the one-year-old record subsidiary of MCA. Diamond has had several hits on Bang Records and has successfully written a number of songs for the Monkees.

Capitol Records signs ? & The Mysterians - the group which had a hit with "96 Tears" on the Cameo-Parkway label. First release is this week - "Make You Mine."

The follow-up single to "Dock of the Bay" by Otis Redding is "The Happy Song" - which Redding recorded last October.

The Beach Boys begin a 17-day national tour with the Maharishi Mahesh Yogi on May 3. Mike Love, senior member of the group, is a student of the Maharishi in India.

The Troggs are touring the U.S. this month, based on the strength of their single "Love is All Around." It's the English group's first-ever U.S. tour.

The Monterey International Pop Festival will go on after all. The Monterey County Fair Board votes 8-1 to allow the pop music spectacular to take place June 21-23 after it had canceled the event. Sponsors Lou Adler and John Phillips will be required to post a \$38,000 bond for police protection, \$15,000 for health services, plus camping facilities for at least 5,000 persons. Another stipulation is that entertainment will stop at 1am. Adler and Phillips hope to persuade the Monterey officials to lower several of the financial regulations. Last year's event drew 40,000 persons at the three-day event.



Bobby Gentry signs a contract with BBC-TV to do six half-hour color specials in England beginning in May. She becomes the first American artist ever signed for her own BBC-TV series. The specials will be taped in London with format, supporting talent

and guests to be selected by Miss Gentry.

Mercury Records releases the single "Color Blind," which relates to Martin Luther King's death. The record was written and recorded by Randy Barlow and produced by Don Costa.

Radio news - FM station scores major ratings coup - In New York City - WOR-FM scores in the Pulse ratings with a 10 share - 6p-midnight - With rival WMCA-AM slipping to a 9 share. WABC-AM gets an 15 share for the same period. This is the first time an FM station has had these kinds of ratings and it's the talk of the industry. The night time numbers are double the ratings WOR-FM had with progressive top-40 and Murray the K - which hit a five share. When Bill Drake took over programming for WOR-FM, he had a different direction - mixing oldies with current hits. Drake says it is an effort to "break down the distinction between AM and FM." "My theory is simple - play the things people like from a large list. This includes Chuck Berry, Elvis Presley, the Moonglows, the Penguins and the Five Satins ... Rock 'n' roll stations (like WMCA and WABC), were only going back two years in their selection of oldies. So you had a void. My philosophy was to shoot for the audience that Alan Freed had created here. I felt the potential of FM had not been reached; it was logical to me that persons between 18-34 years of age were more likely to own FM sets than youths 13-14 years old."

Radio news - CBS announces that WBBM radio (780) in Chicago is going all-news May 6 and that KCBS (740) in San Francisco is going all-news May 27. All Dj's and talk hosts at these stations are seeking other work.

Howard Miller - the top morning man in Chicago at WIND, is suspended after he made remarks following the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Miller is reported to have said that if the Chicago schools were closed for the funeral of dr. King they should also be closed for Chicago's "brave police and firemen." The station was immediately bombarded with hostile calls.

Ted Atkins, formerly operations manager of WOL, Washington, DC, is named Program Director of CKLW, Detroit ... Chuck Buel is leaving KIMN in Denver to join WLS, Chicago as the 6-9pm jock.
